of getting a young bearded dragon is

that you are directly in charge of

giving them that great start in life

this was not the case with my bearded

05:11

dragon my bearded dragon is severely

05:13

stunted he is a rescue and I would say

05:16

that my dragon is not an accurate

05:18

representation of a super healthy

05:20

bearded dragon he is stunted he's not

05:22

gonna get much bigger he is a little bit

05:24

weedy despite the fact he does eat a lot

05:27

where are you sausage oh I see you he's

05:30

right there so while it is a truly

05:34

magical thing to watch your bearded

05:35

dragon go from a little juvenile all the

05:37

way to a big healthy majestic dragon

05:39

it does cost quite a lot baby bearded

05:42

dragons need a lot of protein when

05:44

they're young and a lot of calcium and a

05:46

lot of care they are voracious eaters

05:49

and if you're planning on getting a baby

05:51

just make sure that you factor in to

05:53

your costs that they're going to need to

05:54

eat every single day so if you don't

05:57

want to spend a ton of money feeding and

05:59

feeding and feeding your bearded dragon

06:00

for the first two issues of its lifespan

06:02

then maybe an adult might be a better

06:05

way forward now one dragon or two this

06:09

is entirely up to you but if you're

06:11

going to be getting more than one

06:12
bearded dragon keep them separately when

you go into a lot of pet stores or even

into reptile Expos you will see all the

babies looking super cute hanging out
06:20
together like basking on top of each
06:22
other looking like total chill buddies
06:24
but that's not gonna last bearded

dragons are very territorial and if you

keep a pet
06:29
like say two males or two females they
06:32
will fight of course if you keep a male
06:34
and a female together you're gonna get
06:36
babies lots and lots of babies if you
06:38
are keeping yours together and they're
06:40
producing lots of eggs just realize that
06:42
even if you are discarding the eggs and
06:44
therefore not technically like you know
06:46
breeding them and selling them you're
06:48
still putting your female bearded dragon
06:49

under a lot of stress she's using a lot
06:51
of calcium so please just keep your
06:54
bearded dragons completely separate from
06:55
each other they don't need to hang out
06:57
and Netflix and chill with each other
06:58
they're happy just to chill by
07:00
themselves housing your bearded dragon
07:02
with enclosure size the bigger the
07:04
better
07:05
your dragon will use all of the space as
07:07
much as possible my bearded dragon is a
07:10
stunted individual and lives in a 40
07:12
gallon tank although he does get a lot
07:14
of supervise Din Richman tin pens he is
07:17
do an upgrade typically I would say that
07:19
75 gallons for an adult is a decent
07:21
sized space but the bigger the better by
07:24
providing more space your dragon will be
07:27
happier healthier and will display more
07:29
interesting and natural behaviors two of

07:31

my favourite enclosures which I've kept

07:33

bearded dragons in in the past are herp

07:35

tags and vision enclosures they're made

07:37

of plastic and therefore don't reflect

07:39

back at your bearded dragon the way that

07:41

glass does some bearded dragons stress

07:43

in glass cages as they feel too exposed

07:45

or they think that their reflection is a

07:47

rival if this happens you can fold a

07:50

piece of paper on the outside of the

07:52

enclosure to minimize their reflections

07:54

a bearded dragon setup should have the

07:56

following a basking spot and a cool spot

07:59

hammocks and ledges for lounging

08:01

climbing and basking a hiding place or a

08:04

hide substrate food dish textured items

08:08

like logs for climbing a safe soaking

08:11

dish heating and lighting lighting can

08:14

be a little bit daunting for new owners

08:15

so I'm gonna break it down for you
08:18
your biddie dragon requires two bulbs
08:20
one which has UVA and UVB and another
08:23
which provides heat for the UVA and UVB
08:26
it's recommended to use a bowl which
08:28
allows light to span around two-thirds
08:31
of the dragon's enclosure both arcadia
08:33
and zoo Med manufacture fantastic UVA
08:36
and UVB lights reptiles needs special
08:39
lighting in order to actually get the
08:40
nutrients from their food
08:42
now heating in your enclosure you should
08:44
have a warmer end and a cooler and your
08:47
baited dragon should be given the chance
08:49
to choose whether it wants to go into
08:50
the cooler side or into the warmer side
08:52
and often you'll notice that your
08:54
bearded dragons will actually go from
08:55
one side to the other quite regularly
08:57
this is because they are thermo

08:58

regulating bearded dragons need to be

09:01

able to choose if they want to have a

09:02

little bit more heat or a little bit

09:04

less so absolutely you can use different

09:06

heaters like spot lamps or you can even

09:09

use a ceramic heater which is based in

09:11

one side of the enclosure do not under

09:14

any circumstances be tricked or fooled

09:17

into buying what's known as a heat rock

09:20

heat rocks have been known to cause a

09:22

lot of problems not only do they

09:24

actually overheat and therefore burn

09:26

your animal but they've been known to

09:28

also start house fires so for this

09:31

reason no matter what heat source you

09:32

are using just please don't go for heat

09:34

rocks always use a thermostat a good

09:37

reliable thermostat the thermostat that

09:39

I use is the ISTAT and this is one that

09:42

I had shipped over from the UK it's
09:44
definitely something that I trust I love
09:46
that it's touchscreen I love that it
09:47
gives off a really loud piercing alarm
09:49
so for your heating and lighting have
09:51
everything hooked up to a thermostat and
09:53
hook that thermostat up to a timer
09:55
because your bearded dragon is not an
09:58
animal that wants to be awake all of the
10:00
time they do sleep at night because they
10:02
are a diurnal species diurnal meaning
10:05
that they wake up during the day as
10:06
opposed to a nocturnal animal which
10:08
wakes up at night now you do get some
10:10
nocturnal lizards and geckos
10:11
but the bearded dragon is not one of
10:13
them some people do have the belief that
10:15
red bulbs don't really bother bearded
10:17
dragons but I personally think it's
10:19
better to give them absolute peace quiet

10:20

and darkness at nighttime so hook

10:23

everything up to a timer for us every

10:25

night at 9 p.m. boom everything goes off

10:27

and then again at about 6 a.m. boom

10:29

everything comes back on again picking

10:31

the substrate yes up straight so

10:35

substrates everyone's favorite

10:37

polarizing topic when it comes to

10:39

bearded dragons when it comes to keeping

10:42

a healthy bearded dragon substrate is

10:43

something you have to consider very very

10:45

carefully because some substrates can

10:47

actually be so detrimental to your

10:49

bibbed dragon that you're bid a dragon

10:51

can die yes in particular I am talking

10:54

about

10:54

sans and especially calcium sands

10:57

calcium sand is irresistible to so many

11:00

bearded dragons and you will find a lot

11:02

of bearded dragons just can't help
11:03
themselves except to lap up this amazing
11:05
calcium rich sand but here's the issue
11:08
it can often cause what's known as an
11:10
impaction is when everything gets
11:13
so messed up on the inside and
11:15
everything sticks together that your
11:16
bearded dragon physically can't pass any
11:19
fecal matter and it can all become very
11:21
very bacteria-ridden and cause an
11:23
infection and your bearded dragon will
11:25
die without surgery some bearded dragon
11:28
owners find that their bearded dragon
11:30
loves using sand or calcium sand and
11:32
that they have no issues I have
11:34
personally kept bearded dragons with
11:37
sand and without sand I have not had any
11:40
issues with any bit of dragons having
11:43
impactions however because it does
11:45
happen quite frequently with other

11:47

people I will not be recommending

11:50

calcium sand in this video what I

11:52

personally use and what I personally

11:54

recommend is a sand mat the sand mat

11:58

that I use is from zoo Med and it's

12:00

literally a roll out mat which is sort

12:03

of like a lino bottom and it's got sand

12:05

stuck to it so the sand doesn't come up

12:08

it's not calcium sand either so it's not

12:10

the kind of sand which really entices

12:12

your bearded dragon to lick it instead

12:15

it just produces like a nice texture

12:17

full substrate which will help to keep

12:20

the bearded dragons nails in check some

12:22

other substrates which you might be

12:24

interested in using a paper towel it's

12:27

very difficult for a bearded dragon to

12:28

actually chew eat consume and therefore

12:31

become impacted with paper towel it's

12:33

also really easy to replace and it's
12:35
very affordable so if your bearded
12:38
dragon does make a mess as it will
12:40
inevitably do all you have to do is peel
12:42
it off and discard it and you're left
12:44
with a nice clean enclosure which you
12:46
can then clean with a vinegar solution
12:48
or something similar another Pro when it
12:50
comes to using paper towel is that any
12:53
live food you happen to use will stand
12:55
out really well against the white of the
12:57
paper towel making it really simple for
13:00
your young or juvenile bed dragons to
13:02
find their food another favorite to use
13:04
is
13:06
newspaper please forgive that it's not
13:08
completely lining the bottom of this
13:10
little fake enclosure I have this is an
13:12
action enclosure for anyone this is
13:13
literally just a bin that I'd keep my

13:15

citizen anyway you don't need to know

13:17

that very similar to paper towel you can

13:19

also use newspaper which is fantastic

13:21

has often free because people don't care

13:24

about the environment and like to give

13:25

us spam mail to I letterbox therefore

13:28

it's easy to put it to use although I

13:30

actually read them I'm that sad person

13:33

that reads spam mail what imagine your

13:35

home totally organized that's never

13:39

gonna happen but this is my opinion on

tile on paper towel and on newspaper and

you're probably not gonna like what I'm

gonna say but it comes from a caring

place I promise I don't like it the

reason why I personally do not like it

don't like it it's because I don't want

to keep my bearded dragon to clean the

logic behind this is that I want my

bearded dragon to have a decent immune
14:08
system it's not always that my bearded
14:10
dragon is always inside its enclosure
14:12
sometimes it's in other places for
14:13
example in this exercise pen or in the
14:16
enrichment pod which I'm having
14:17
delivered soon I prefer to leave a
14:19
little bit of something behind just so
14:21
they get used to a little bit more of
14:22
that bacteria and it seems been working
14:24
out really well for my bearded dragon who
14:26
has actually come on in leaps and bounds
14:28
in the last year I'm very happy to allow
14:30
my bearded dragon to have a little bit
14:32
of manageable dirt every now and then
14:35
just so his immune system stays good and
14:37
strong it really is up to you to form an
14:39
opinion that you think is gonna be best

14:40

for you your circumstance and your

14:42

bearded dragon but I would say stay away

14:45

from the calcium sand it's just not

14:48

worth the risk

14:48

diet bearded dragon diet he knows I'm

14:56

talking about food juvenile and sub

14:58

adult bearded dragons certainly need a

15:00

much higher protein intake than an adult

15:03

bearded dragon for this reason 80%

15:06

invertebrates and 20% leafy greens is

15:09

what I would recommend after about two

15:11

years of age you can switch this over to

15:12

about 60% worth of leafy greens and 40%

15:16

invertebrates some of the best invertebr

15:18

you can feed your bearded dragon are

15:20

dubia roaches dubia roaches are actually

15:23

very easy to create your own colony of

15:25

or you can actually buy them relatively

15:27

inexpensively from most pet stores dubia

15:30

roaches are packed full of wonderful
15:32
proteins and vitamins for your bearded
15:34
dragon and because dubia roaches can be
15:36
very very quick on their feet it also
15:38
provides enrichment and exercise for
15:41
your bearded dragon because they
15:42
physically have to run after their food
15:44
you can also feed mealworms and super
15:46
worms in moderation mealworms and super
15:49
worms have a lot more chitin in them
15:51
which is very difficult for a bearded
15:52
dragon to digest in large quantities you
15:55
can also feed horned worms if you really
15:57
really like there are fantastic source
15:59
again of both protein and also water
16:01
because a lot of what a very expensive
16:05
horned worm actually is is water so
16:08
again it's a fantastic source of protein
16:10
for your being a dragon but a cup of
16:13
about this size is going to cost you

16:15
about \$20 in most stores that's US
16:18
dollars by the way so not particularly
16:21
the best if you're on a budget but they
16:23
make a lovely treat every now and again
16:24
now if you're lucky enough to live in a
16:26
very bio diverse healthy area then you
16:29
might have insects at your disposal
16:30
outside but I highly recommend that you
16:33
do not use any wild court invertebrates
16:35
the reason why I suggest this is because
16:37
you just don't know if they have any
16:39
parasites or if they've been eating
16:41
anything with any pesticides of course
16:43
anything that your feeders eat goes
16:45
directly into your bearded dragon so I
16:47
highly recommend that you purchase your
16:49
feeders from a store in particular never
16:51
feed any wild horned worms to your
16:54
bearded dragon in the wild horn worms
16:56

love to eat nightshade which happens to
16:58
be a sedative and a poison so although
17:00
the horned one that's absolutely fine
17:01
it's probably not going to be okay to
17:03
feed to your bearded dragon which might
17:05
end up absorbing the toxins from those
17:07
leaves another fantastic source of
17:09
protein which is really easy to find in
17:11
the UK but which you just cannot get in
17:13
the US because they're actually illegal
17:15
are locust locust are a wonderful source
17:18
of protein and they climb as well along
17:20
with Dubya locust are a fantastic source
17:24
of protein
17:24
bearded dragons and it is such a shame
17:26
that you cannot get them in the USA
17:28
because they are an agricultural pest
17:30
but this is what they look like if you
17:32
live in the UK or in Europe it's most
17:34
likely that you'll be able to find these

17:36

very very inexpensively I highly

17:38

recommend Dubya and locusts to make up

17:40

the bulk of the invertebrates that you

17:42

feed to your bearded dragons greens

17:44

let's talk about greens some of the best

17:48

greens you can feed our dandelion greens

17:50

bearded dragons love dandelion greens in

17:53

the summer you can even pick them for

17:55

yourself but do not pick them if you're

17:57

not sure that your lawn is completely

17:59

pesticide free for some reason the US is

18:02

completely obsessed with having

18:03

pesticides on their lawns I am NOT a fan

18:06

I do not have any pesticides on my lawns

18:08

because I like to encourage biodiversity

18:11

and not kill it and I'm not a monster so

18:13

if you want to pick your own leafy

18:15

greens then only do it from a place you

18:17

know 110 percent does not get treated

18:19

with pesticides from your local
18:21
supermarket you should be able to get
18:23
other really fantastic beneficial greens
18:25
just like turnip greens mustard greens
18:27
collard greens all of these are
18:30
fantastic avoid feeding greens like
18:32
spinach and kale they do nothing
18:34
whatsoever for your bearded dragon in
18:36
fact they actually SAP your bearded
18:38
dragon off the ability to actually
18:39
absorb calcium and the food items which
18:42
you can feed to your bearded dragons are
18:43
a little bits of hard-boiled egg every
18:45
now and then a little bit of apple or a
18:47
blueberry every now and then is a lovely
18:49
treat when giving your bearded dragon
18:51
their greens you should add a high
18:52
quality calcium and vitamin supplement
18:55
you can find these at most pet stores
18:57
which stock reptile accessories reptile

18:59

calcium and vitamin D and reptile herp

19:02

to bite are great supplements in the USA

19:04

I also like to switch these up on

19:06

occasion with supplements from the UK

19:08

such as Nutria Belle and Vie Innate

19:10

handling and enrichment now let's talk

19:12

about handling your bearded dragon young

19:15

and juvenile bearded dragons are always

19:17

going to be a little bit more flighty

19:19

and scared when it comes to being held

19:21

so as soon as you bring your bearded

19:23

dragon home and you have a minute set up

19:24

just leave them alone for a couple of

19:26

days to set in once your bearded dragon

19:28

has established a routine of a day and

19:31

night cycle as well as eating and you

19:33

can see that they are pooping absolutely

19:34

fine then you can start handling them

19:36

for short periods at

19:38

start out this way and allow them to
19:40
just sit in your hand and of course be
19:42
aware that your bearded dragon may
19:43
suddenly decide to shoot off into the
19:45
abyss so be very very cautious and keep
19:48
them low to the ground or on your lap
19:50
the first few times you hold them when
19:51
picking up your bearded dragon never
19:53
pick him up by the tail they do not have
19:55
a prehensile or semi prehensile tail
19:58
which is a tail which acts like a fifth
20:00
limb which they can wrap around a bit
20:02
like a monkey they don't have that so if
20:04
you grab your bearded dragon and pick
20:06
them up by the tail you can cause
20:08
irreparable damage to their spine don't
20:10
take it personally if your bidden dragon
20:12
doesn't want to hang out with you
20:13
initially this will come with time so if
20:16
your bearded dragon doesn't want to hang

20:18

out with you or they're constantly

20:19

trying to get away just put them back in

20:21

their enclosure because you don't want

20:22

them to associate any negativity with

20:25

your handling sessions so this is bad

20:27

ideas enrichment pod I actually share

20:29

this with a bunch of my animals whenever

20:30

they come into my office and it's

20:33

actually created by a beautiful company

20:36

called clearly loved pets it's a really

20:38

versatile wonderful pen hashtag not

20:41

sponsored so on the way in it's what

20:44

I've got in here is a bunch of different

20:45

things that bearded dragon can actually

20:48

enjoy he's actually because it's quite

20:50

late at night now he's taking a little

20:52

snooze under here but the great thing is

20:54

that with an enrichment pod which you

20:57

don't have to have you can just do this

20:58

in a supervised space you don't have to
21:00
have like a fancy pen or look I've been
21:02
filming a lot I have a water dish where
21:06
he can come and get some water and I
21:07
also put in different things for him to
21:09
smell taste and interact with hence why
21:12
I have a pair of shoes in here these are
21:15
some of my irregular toys shoes would
21:17
like crayfish at the bottom you know
21:19
when it comes to enrichment anything can
21:21
really be used as enrichment from new
21:24
things that he doesn't get to smell that
21:25
often you can introduce different safe
21:29
fragrances for them to smell for example
21:31
like you know rubbing a bit of grass
21:32
onto a piece of paper for them to smell
21:36
anything really can be enrichment and
21:39
it's a really great thing to give you a
21:41
bit of dragon something different to do
21:42
he's super sleepy right now I've

21:44

actually just done this after filming

21:46

the majority of my video and now it is

21:49

dark outside

21:50

so he's ready to go to bed from there

21:52

take him home now and start to wrap

21:55

things up but we're going to continue on

21:56

with this video because it's still only

21:58

like halfway through this video if it's

22:00

a warm sunny day you can fit your

22:02

bearded dragon with a reptile harness

22:04

and give them additional exercise

22:06

outdoors dragon maintenance so

22:09

maintaining your bearded dragon we've

22:11

spoken about food we've spoken about

22:13

heating lighting and substrate but

22:15

your bearded dragon being a growing

22:17

lizard will actually shed its skin

22:19

periodically so you should aim to allow

22:21

your bearded dragon to soak I personally

22:24

always have a soaking dish for my
22:25
bearded dragon because my bearded dragon
22:27
is a freak and will actually drink
22:29
standing water which many bearded
22:31
dragons won't but it will also soak its
22:34
own body and this is fantastic for
22:36
helping my bearded dragon to actually
22:37
shed its old skin I'm sure that some of
22:40
you will have bearded dragons which
22:41
refuse to soak themselves in which case
22:44
that job comes to you you'll have to
22:46
fill up either your bathtub or a
22:48
separate soaking tub with about as much
22:50

to see how make an incredible piece of art as you learn now there's no such thing as a beginner pet or a beginner exotic pet or reptile but I do think that bearded dragons are not only one of the best lizards you can keep but definitely one of the best reptiles in general for your viewing enjoyment I'm going to be breaking down all of the different informational segments into different chapters so if you're interested in a specific chapter like two a healthy bearded dragon or heating and lighting or even substrate then go and check out in my description box below where you can find really useful timestamps to get you where you need to go but I fully suggest that you stay for the entire duration of this video because you might learn something that you didn't know before and because I

resources now you have to go away for a
little while because I need to give my
full attention to everyone who's
watching us so you can go in your view
to full exercise pod behind me is that
okay let's go how to pick a healthy
dragon so picking a healthy dragon and
where to find them there's a couple of
places you can actually find wonderful
bearded dragons one is directly from a
breeder this is a great place to go if
you're looking for a particular type of
bearded dragon you do get different

bearded dragon morphs or different colorations and skin types if that's what you're looking for then a breeder is probably the best choice for you there is of course the very standard pet stores that you can go to which have a variety of bearded dragons I don't normally recommend these pet stores because they tend to bulk buy from mass producers and I don't think a bit of dragons are always the best quality but it's really up to you if you want to go for a big chain pet store which I personally do not recommend or if you want to go to maybe a smaller boutique kind of pet store which might have you know connections with smaller scale breeders which is probably a better way forward you can also go to the reptile Expos in your area depending on where you live especially in the USA you are bound to find reptile Expos

reptile Expos depending on the ones that you go to you get the good ones and you also get the bad ones you can usually tell which vendors you want to stay away from the ones that really cram their tables full of stock that looks really dehydrated or missing limbs or have loads of stuck shed avoid avoid avoid but a great sign that you're dealing with good vendors good breeders or good pet stores is that they take time to fully explain explain explain the pros and the cons of keeping these lizards as pets and of course my favorite place rescues there are tons of reptile rescues if you want to try and find them a great place to go is on Facebook look up different reptile rescues ask questions or you can even just like call up a normal rescue and ask them if they have any affiliates or know any sort of

like sister charities in the area which deal with reptiles so just send them an email give them a call they might be able to point you in the right direction now do you want a baby dragon or an adult dragon it really is up to you I personally would rather go for an adult bearded dragon that's just me I find that many people like to purchase bearded dragons as babies because they want to watch them grow one of the pros of getting a young bearded dragon is that you are directly in charge of giving them that great start in life this was not the case with my bearded dragon my bearded dragon is severely stunted he is a rescue and I would say that my dragon is not an accurate representation of a super healthy bearded dragon he is stunted he's not gonna get much bigger he is a little bit weedy despite the fact he does eat a lot

where are you sausage oh I see you he's
right there so while it is a truly
magical thing to watch your bearded
dragon go from a little juvenile all the
way to a big healthy majestic dragon
it does cost quite a lot baby bearded
dragons need a lot of protein when
they're young and a lot of calcium and a
lot of care they are voracious eaters
and if you're planning on getting a baby
just make sure that you factor in to
your costs that they're going to need to
eat every single day so if you don't
want to spend a ton of money feeding and
feeding and feeding your bearded dragon
for the first two issues of its lifespan
then maybe an adult might be a better
way forward now one dragon or two this
is entirely up to you but if you're
going to be getting more than one
bearded dragon keep them separately when
you go into a lot of pet stores or even

into reptile Expos you will see all the babies looking super cute hanging out together like basking on top of each other looking like total chill buddies but that's not gonna last bearded dragons are very territorial and if you keep a pet like say two males or two females they will fight of course if you keep a male and a female together you're gonna get babies lots and lots of babies if you are keeping yours together and they're producing lots of eggs just realize that even if you are discarding the eggs and therefore not technically like you know breeding them and selling them you're still putting your female bearded dragon under a lot of stress she's using a lot of calcium so please just keep your bearded dragons completely separate from each other they don't need to hang out and Netflix and chill with each other

they're happy just to chill by themselves housing your bearded dragon with enclosure size the bigger the better your dragon will use all of the space as much as possible my bearded dragon is a stunted individual and lives in a 40 gallon tank although he does get a lot of supervise Din Richman tin pens he is do an upgrade typically I would say that 75 gallons for an adult is a decent sized space but the bigger the better by providing more space your dragon will be happier healthier and will display more interesting and natural behaviors two of my favourite enclosures which I've kept bearded dragons in in the past are herp tags and vision enclosures they're made of plastic and therefore don't reflect back at your bearded dragon the way that glass does some bearded dragons stress in glass cages as they feel too exposed

or they think that their reflection is a rival if this happens you can fold a piece of paper on the outside of the enclosure to minimize their reflections a bearded dragon setup should have the following a basking spot and a cool spot hammocks and ledges for lounging climbing and basking a hiding place or a hide substrate food dish textured items like logs for climbing a safe soaking dish heating and lighting lighting can be a little bit daunting for new owners so I'm gonna break it down for you your biddie dragon requires two bulbs one which has UVA and UVB and another which provides heat for the UVA and UVB it's recommended to use a bowl which allows light to span around two-thirds of the dragon's enclosure both arcadia and zoo Med manufacture fantastic UVA and UVB lights reptiles needs special lighting in order to actually get the

nutrients from their food

now heating in your enclosure you should have a warmer end and a cooler and your baited dragon should be given the chance to choose whether it wants to go into the cooler side or into the warmer side and often you'll notice that your bearded dragons will actually go from one side to the other quite regularly this is because they are thermo regulating bearded dragons need to be able to choose if they want to have a little bit more heat or a little bit less so absolutely you can use different heaters like spot lamps or you can even use a ceramic heater which is based in one side of the enclosure do not under any circumstances be tricked or fooled into buying what's known as a heat rock heat rocks have been known to cause a lot of problems not only do they actually overheat and therefore burn

your animal but they've been known to also start house fires so for this reason no matter what heat source you are using just please don't go for heat rocks always use a thermostat a good reliable thermostat the thermostat that I use is the ISTAT and this is one that I had shipped over from the UK it's definitely something that I trust I love that it's touchscreen I love that it gives off a really loud piercing alarm so for your heating and lighting have everything hooked up to a thermostat and hook that thermostat up to a timer because your bearded dragon is not an animal that wants to be awake all of the time they do sleep at night because they are a diurnal species diurnal meaning that they wake up during the day as opposed to a nocturnal animal which wakes up at night now you do get some nocturnal lizards and geckos

but the bearded dragon is not one of
them some people do have the belief that
red bulbs don't really bother bearded
dragons but I personally think it's
better to give them absolute peace quiet
and darkness at nighttime so hook
everything up to a timer for us every
night at 9 p.m. boom everything goes off
and then again at about 6 a.m. boom
everything comes back on again picking
the substrate yes up straight so
substrates everyone's favorite
polarizing topic when it comes to
bearded dragons when it comes to keeping
a healthy bearded dragon substrate is
something you have to consider very very
carefully because some substrates can
actually be so detrimental to your
bided dragon that you're bid a dragon
can die yes in particular I am talking
about
sans and especially calcium sands

calcium sand is irresistible to so many bearded dragons and you will find a lot of bearded dragons just can't help themselves except to lap up this amazing calcium rich sand but here's the issue it can often cause what's known as an impaction is when everything gets so messed up on the inside and everything sticks together that your bearded dragon physically can't pass any fecal matter and it can all become very very bacteria-ridden and cause an infection and your bearded dragon will die without surgery some bearded dragon owners find that their bearded dragon loves using sand or calcium sand and that they have no issues I have personally kept bearded dragons with sand and without sand I have not had any issues with any bit of dragons having impactions however because it does happen quite frequently with other

people I will not be recommending calcium sand in this video what I personally use and what I personally recommend is a sand mat the sand mat that I use is from zoo Med and it's literally a roll out mat which is sort of like a lino bottom and it's got sand stuck to it so the sand doesn't come up it's not calcium sand either so it's not the kind of sand which really entices your bearded dragon to lick it instead it just produces like a nice texture full substrate which will help to keep the bearded dragons nails in check some other substrates which you might be interested in using a paper towel it's very difficult for a bearded dragon to actually chew eat consume and therefore become impacted with paper towel it's also really easy to replace and it's very affordable so if your bearded dragon does make a mess as it will

inevitably do all you have to do is peel
it off and discard it and you're left
with a nice clean enclosure which you
can then clean with a vinegar solution
or something similar another Pro when it
comes to using paper towel is that any
live food you happen to use will stand
out really well against the white of the
paper towel making it really simple for
your young or juvenile bed dragons to
find their food another favorite to use
is

newspaper please forgive that it's not
completely lining the bottom of this
little fake enclosure I have this is an
action enclosure for anyone this is
literally just a bin that I'd keep my
citizen anyway you don't need to know
that very similar to paper towel you can
also use newspaper which is fantastic
has often free because people don't care
about the environment and like to give

us spam mail to I letterbox therefore
it's easy to put it to use although I
actually read them I'm that sad person
that reads spam mail what imagine your
home totally organized that's never
gonna happen but this is my opinion on
tile on paper towel and on newspaper and
you're probably not gonna like what I'm
gonna say but it comes from a caring
place I promise I don't like it the
reason why I personally do not like it
though it's fine for you guys to use I'm
not gonna judge that the reason why I
don't like it it's because I don't want
to keep my bed a dragon to clean the
logic behind this is that I want my
bitter dragon to have a decent immune
system it's not always that my bearded
dragon is always inside its enclosure
sometimes it's in other places for
example in this exercise pen or in the
enrichment pod which I'm having

delivered soon I prefer to leave a
little bit of something behind just so
they get used to a little bit more of
that bacteria and it seems been working
out really well for my bearded dragon who
has actually come on in leaps and bounds
in the last year I'm very happy to allow
my bearded dragon to have a little bit
of manageable dirt every now and then
just so his immune system stays good and
strong it really is up to you to form an
opinion that you think is gonna be best
for you your circumstance and your
bearded dragon but I would say stay away
from the calcium sand it's just not
worth the risk

diet bearded dragon diet he knows I'm
talking about food juvenile and sub
adult bearded dragons certainly need a
much higher protein intake than an adult
bearded dragon for this reason 80%
invertebrates and 20% leafy greens is

what I would recommend after about two years of age you can switch this over to about 60% worth of leafy greens and 40% invertebrates some of the best invertebrates you can feed your bearded dragon are dubia roaches dubia roaches are actually very easy to create your own colony of or you can actually buy them relatively inexpensively from most pet stores dubia roaches are packed full of wonderful proteins and vitamins for your bearded dragon and because dubia roaches can be very very quick on their feet it also provides enrichment and exercise for your bearded dragon because they physically have to run after their food you can also feed mealworms and super worms in moderation mealworms and super worms have a lot more chitin in them which is very difficult for a bearded dragon to digest in large quantities you can also feed horned worms if you really

really like there are fantastic source
again of both protein and also water
because a lot of what a very expensive
horned worm actually is is water so
again it's a fantastic source of protein
for your being a dragon but a cup of
about this size is going to cost you
about \$20 in most stores that's US
dollars by the way so not particularly
the best if you're on a budget but they
make a lovely treat every now and again
now if you're lucky enough to live in a
very bio diverse healthy area then you
might have insects at your disposal
outside but I highly recommend that you
do not use any wild court invertebrates
the reason why I suggest this is because
you just don't know if they have any
parasites or if they've been eating
anything with any pesticides of course
anything that your feeders eat goes
directly into your bearded dragon so I

highly recommend that you purchase your
feeders from a store in particular never
feed any wild horned worms to your
bearded dragon in the wild horn worms
love to eat nightshade which happens to
be a sedative and a poison so although
the horned one that's absolutely fine
it's probably not going to be okay to
feed to your bearded dragon which might
end up absorbing the toxins from those
leaves another fantastic source of
protein which is really easy to find in
the UK but which you just cannot get in
the US because they're actually illegal
are locust locust are a wonderful source
of protein and they climb as well along
with Dubya locust are a fantastic source
of protein
bearded dragons and it is such a shame
that you cannot get them in the USA
because they are an agricultural pest
but this is what they look like if you

live in the UK or in Europe it's most likely that you'll be able to find these very very inexpensively I highly recommend Dubya and locusts to make up the bulk of the invertebrates that you feed to your bearded dragons greens let's talk about greens some of the best greens you can feed our dandelion greens bearded dragons love dandelion greens in the summer you can even pick them for yourself but do not pick them if you're not sure that your lawn is completely pesticide free for some reason the US is completely obsessed with having pesticides on their lawns I am NOT a fan I do not have any pesticides on my lawns because I like to encourage biodiversity and not kill it and I'm not a monster so if you want to pick your own leafy greens then only do it from a place you know 100 percent does not get treated with pesticides from your local

supermarket you should be able to get other really fantastic beneficial greens just like turnip greens mustard greens collard greens all of these are fantastic avoid feeding greens like spinach and kale they do nothing whatsoever for your bearded dragon in fact they actually SAP your bearded dragon off the ability to actually absorb calcium and the food items which you can feed to your bearded dragons are a little bits of hard-boiled egg every now and then a little bit of apple or a blueberry every now and then is a lovely treat when giving your bearded dragon their greens you should add a high quality calcium and vitamin supplement you can find these at most pet stores which stock reptile accessories reptile calcium and vitamin D and reptile herp to bite are great supplements in the USA I also like to switch these up on

occasion with supplements from the UK
such as Nutria Belle and Vie Innate
handling and enrichment now let's talk
about handling your bearded dragon young
and juvenile bearded dragons are always
going to be a little bit more flighty
and scared when it comes to being held
so as soon as you bring your bearded
dragon home and you have a minute set up
just leave them alone for a couple of
days to set in once your bearded dragon
has established a routine of a day and
night cycle as well as eating and you
can see that they are pooping absolutely
fine then you can start handling them
for short periods at
start out this way and allow them to
just sit in your hand and of course be
aware that your bearded dragon may
suddenly decide to shoot off into the
abyss so be very very cautious and keep
them low to the ground or on your lap

the first few times you hold them when picking up your bearded dragon never pick him up by the tail they do not have a prehensile or semi prehensile tail which is a tail which acts like a fifth limb which they can wrap around a bit like a monkey they don't have that so if you grab your bearded dragon and pick them up by the tail you can cause irreparable damage to their spine don't take it personally if your bidded dragon doesn't want to hang out with you initially this will come with time so if your bearded dragon doesn't want to hang out with you or they're constantly trying to get away just put them back in their enclosure because you don't want them to associate any negativity with your handling sessions so this is bad ideas enrichment pod I actually share this with a bunch of my animals whenever they come into my office and it's

actually created by a beautiful company called clearly loved pets it's a really versatile wonderful pen hashtag not sponsored so on the way in it's what I've got in here is a bunch of different things that bearded dragon can actually enjoy he's actually because it's quite late at night now he's taking a little snooze under here but the great thing is that with an enrichment pod which you don't have to have you can just do this in a supervised space you don't have to have like a fancy pen or look I've been filming a lot I have a water dish where he can come and get some water and I also put in different things for him to smell taste and interact with hence why I have a pair of shoes in here these are some of my irregular toys shoes would like crayfish at the bottom you know when it comes to enrichment anything can really be used as enrichment from new

things that he doesn't get to smell that often you can introduce different safe fragrances for them to smell for example like you know rubbing a bit of grass onto a piece of paper for them to smell anything really can be enrichment and it's a really great thing to give you a bit of dragon something different to do he's super sleepy right now I've actually just done this after filming the majority of my video and now it is dark outside so he's ready to go to bed from there take him home now and start to wrap things up but we're going to continue on with this video because it's still only like halfway through this video if it's a warm sunny day you can fit your bearded dragon with a reptile harness and give them additional exercise outdoors dragon maintenance so maintaining your bearded dragon we've

spoken about food we've spoken about
heating lighting and substrate but
you're bitter dragon being a growing
lizard will actually shed its skin
periodically so you should aim to allow
your bitter dragon to soak I personally
always have a soaking dish for my
bearded dragon because my bearded dragon
is a freak and will actually drink
standing water which many bearded
dragons won't but it will also soak its
own body and this is fantastic for
helping my bearded dragon to actually
shed its old skin I'm sure that some of
you will have bearded dragons which
refuse to soak themselves in which case
that job comes to you you'll have to
fill up either your bathtub or a
separate soaking tub with about as much
water as will come up to sort of midway
along your bearded dragon this will
ensure that your bitter dragon does not

drown while soaking your bearded dragons
to help them loosen up their skin before
shedding or if they've got some stuck
shed you should always keep an eye on
your bearded dragon never take your eyes
off your bearded dragon because some are
a little bit dopey and might drown
themselves never submerge your bearded
dragon and water which it cannot
comfortably stand up in and which it

veterinarians today have a little bit of experience with bearded dragons because they are such a popular reptile to keep as pets but you just want to make sure that you definitely have access to a veterinarian in your area one of my most common animal keeping mottos is if you cannot afford a vet you cannot afford the pet and I just want you guys to bear that in mind because costs of actually using a veterinarian can skyrocket especially when you're talking about operations x-rays speakers that can all definitely add up not to mention any kind of medication some owners feed their bearded dragons a little too much while chubby dragons are very cute this can cause huge health problems if your dragon is getting a bit pudgy cut back on the treats and encourage more exercise another common ailment that you might find is that your bearded dragon

might for whatever reason cut one of its nails and it might bleed if this is the case then a great way to actually deal with a nail which is bleeding a lot is cornstarch always keep a little bit of cornstarch around this is also really helpful if you accidentally cut the quick or again if your bearded dragon accidentally breaks its nail down to the quick little bit of cornstarch on there which you can get in any grocery store will be able to help stop the bleeding calcium is vital to bearded dragons if they don't have enough calcium they can develop MBD which is metabolic bone disease it's a bit like rickets and humans the bones become a weak Bend and can easily break female bearded dragons can also be susceptible to calcium crashes after laying eggs so if your female dragon lays eggs increase her calcium intake other resources all right
